The Siena School Expanding to Northern Virginia in 2021

Leader in dyslexia education announces new campus opening in Oakton, Virginia

Silver Spring, Maryland, March 8, 2021— The Siena School announced it is opening a second campus in Oakton, Virginia in fall 2021. Siena's nationally-recognized program serves bright students with dyslexia and similar language-based learning differences. In the 2021-2022 school year, Siena's Oakton campus will serve grades 3–8. The school plans to grow into high school grades in subsequent years.

"After years of discussion and planning, we are excited to finally make The Siena School more accessible to Virginia students and families," said Erik Heyer, founder and board chair of The Siena School. "Families and professionals in Northern Virginia had long asked if Siena could expand to the area. We had to pause our Virginia campus plans last year due to the pandemic, but ongoing and increasing interest made it evident this effort was as important as ever."

With as many as 20% of children in the U.S. estimated as having dyslexia, there are thousands of students in Northern Virginia and surrounding areas who could benefit from specialized instruction for students with language-based learning differences.
